ABOUT UNIVERSITI PUTRA MALAYSIA SARAWAK (UPMS)

Introduction

Universiti Putra Malaysia Sarawak Campus, also known as UPMS, is a twin campus of Universiti Putra Malaysia located at the main campus in Serdang, Selangor. Currently, UPMS has two faculties: the Faculty of Agricultural and Forestry Sciences and the Faculty of Humanities, Management and Science, along with the Institute of Borneo Ecoscience research institute. UPMS offers study programmes at the PhD, master's, bachelor's, diploma, and pre-diploma levels.

Our story

Formerly operating as Universiti Putra Malaysia Kampus Bintulu (UPMKB), the campus was relaunched in November 2001 under UPM's 2001–2010 strategic development plan. Later, on 30 June 2025, it adopted a new name as part of a broader rebranding initiative.

Universiti Putra Malaysia Sarawak Campus (UPMS) is the oldest university campus in Sarawak, tracing its origins to 10 August 1974 when it operated from a temporary base at the National Resources Training Centre, Semenggok, Kuching. After relocating to its permanent 714-hectare site—13 km outside Bintulu—in June 1987, the lush rainforest surroundings became an outdoor laboratory rich in unique flora and fauna.

The campus was formally recognised on 27 August 1987 through the Universiti Pertanian Malaysia (Kampus) Order (No. 2) 1987, establishing three learning centres: Applied Sciences, Basic Sciences, and Social Sciences and Management. These centres initially offered diploma programmes in Agriculture, Forestry, and Agribusiness, supported by a pre-diploma foundation course.

Reopened on November 5, 2001, Universiti Putra Malaysia Kampus Bintulu (UPMKB) remains a twin campus of Universiti Putra Malaysia, anchored by the Faculty of Agriculture and Food Sciences. Five departments—Crop Science, Forestry Science, Social Science, Basic Science and Engineering, and Animal Science and Fishery—deliver academic pathways from diploma to PhD, integrating classroom instruction with hands-on fieldwork in nearby farms, plantations, rivers, and experimental plots.

Modern facilities, residential colleges, laboratories, an agro-technology park, recreational amenities, and research centres collectively accommodate up to 2,800 students while advancing research that supports Sarawak's bio-resource-based economy and the wider Southeast Asian agri-food sector.



Now

On June 30, 2025, UPMKB was officially renamed Universiti Putra Malaysia Sarawak (UPMS). UPM Chancellor Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah announced the change at a formal ceremony held at Istana Alam Shah, Klang. This rebranding reflects an expanded mission for the campus to improve teaching, research, and innovation in areas like agriculture, food security, and renewable energy in East Malaysia. The new name aligns with Sarawak's Post-COVID-19 Development Strategy 2030 and advances UPM's long-term goals, while the campus continues to serve as a branch of Universiti Putra Malaysia.

UPMS now emphasises stronger regional collaboration and sector-specific expertise. A restructuring initiated in 2018 identified five key strategic areas—agriculture, forestry, industrial chemistry, renewable energy, and ethnic studies—that guide its academic plans. Starting from July 1, 2020, these priorities are implemented through two faculties: the Faculty of Agricultural Science and Forestry (FSPH) and the Faculty of Humanities, Management and Science (FKPS). Together, they support the campus's vision to become a leading centre for sustainable development and human capital development in Sarawak and the Borneo region.






