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## **ABOUT UNIVERSITI PUTRA MALAYSIA SARAWAK**

### Introduction

Universiti Putra Malaysia Sarawak (UPMS) is a branch campus of Universiti Putra Malaysia located in Bintulu, Sarawak. It is the only research university in the island of Borneo. UPMS is located 13 km from the town of Bintulu and is surrounded by lush green forest rich with many different species of flora and fauna. The campus grounds cover an area of 714.178 hectares with facilities that can accommodate up to 2,800 students.

### How it started

It all started way back in August 10<sup>th</sup>, 1974 when it was set up as a temporary campus under the National Resources Training Centre in Semenggok, Kuching. In June 1987, it was located to the current permanent campus site in Bintulu, Sarawak. On 27<sup>th</sup> August, 1987, Universiti Pertanian Malaysia Sarawak was officially established as a branch campus through the Perintah Universiti Pertanian Malaysia (Kampus) 2 (No.2) 1987 with 3 centres of learning. The three centres are namely, the Centre for Applied Sciences, the Centre for Basic Sciences and the Centre for Social Sciences and Management. Three diploma programmes namely the Diploma in Agriculture, the Diploma in Forestry and the Diploma in Agribusiness and one pre-diploma programme, the Preparatory Science Programme were offered.

### Now

Universiti Putra Malaysia Malaysia Sarawak currently comprises of two faculties, the Faculty of Agricultural and Forestry Sciences and the Faculty of Humanities, Management and Science. The Faculty of Agricultural and Forestry Sciences comprises three academic departments, the Department of Animal Science and Fisheries, the Department of Crop Science and the Department of Forestry Science. Meanwhile, the Faculty of Humanities, Management and Science houses two academic departments which are the Department of Science and Technology and the Department of Social Science and Management. Both faculties offer various Diploma, Bachelor, Masters and PhD programmes.

On 30<sup>th</sup> June 2025, Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) has officially rebranded its Bintulu Campus as Universiti Putra Malaysia Sarawak (UPMS), underscoring the university's commitment to advancing agricultural excellence and research development in East Malaysia. This rebranding reflects UPM's strategic vision to strengthen its leadership in agriculture, food security, sustainable development, and community empowerment in Borneo.

## **ABOUT SUNGAI ASAP, BELAGA, SARAWAK**

Sungai Asap, located in the Belaga District of Sarawak, is home to one of the largest resettlement schemes in the state of Sarawak. Established in the late 1990s following the construction of the Bakun Hydroelectric Dam, the area became the new settlement site for thousands of Orang Ulu (Kayan, Kenyah, Lahanan, Ukit and Penan Talun). The settlement of the people in Sungai Asap includes fifteen longhouses, each with its own unique cultural features and attractions for its respective communities.

The design of the longhouses in Sungai Asap was originally the same, but thanks to their creativity, they have reflected the richness of the Orang Ulu traditions. For example, the Ruai or veranda of the longhouse has been modified to incorporate the richness of cultural heritage to show social life by providing space for ceremonies, cultural performances and community discussion. This open event space is a place that is maintained as a Cultural Festival venue not only to pass down the practice of longhouse life but also as an indigenous heritage in helping to promote Sungai Asap as a cultural tourism destination.

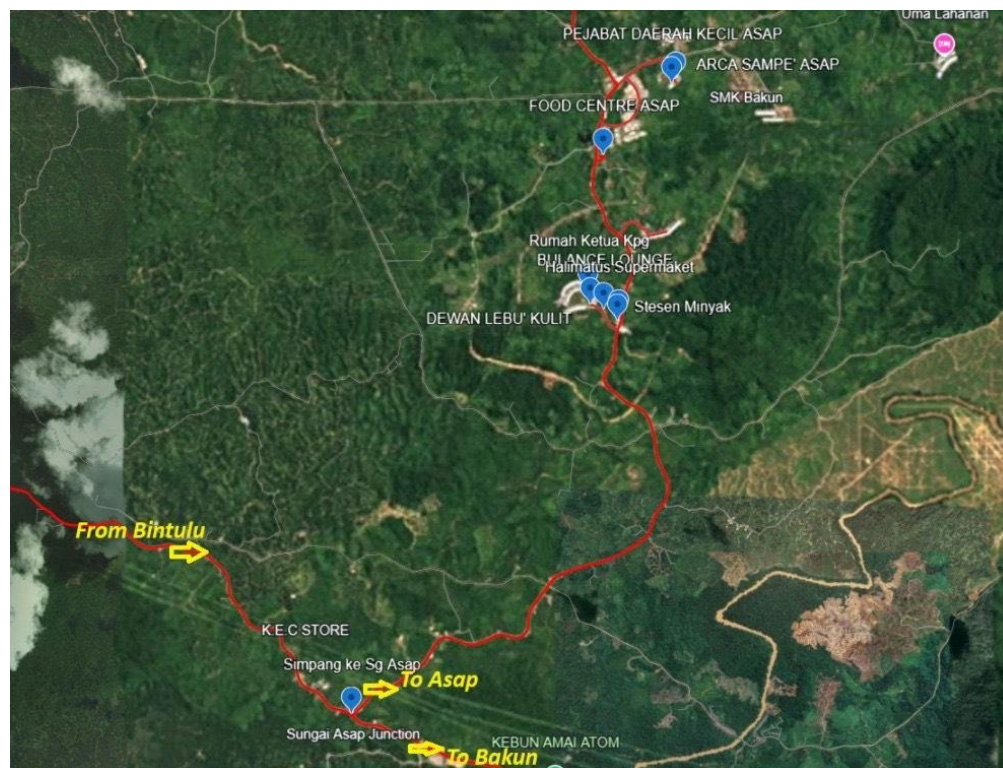
The Orang Ulu community in Sungai Asap is famous for its artistic, customary and cultural heritage that needs to be recognized by the community from outside their district in Sarawak. As a result of the sincere efforts of all parties in developing a sustainable community, they are increasingly skilled in highlighting bead weaving, wood carving and textile weaving in accordance with their identity. This community has produced many items that carry motifs and symbolism that display the hierarchy of social life, customs and culture practiced. The placement of the World's Largest Sape'/Sampik Musical Instrument Sculpture, which symbolizes the cultural heritage of the Orang Ulu community, is an attraction in Asap. In addition, the Orang Ulu community, especially the Kenyah ethnic group, will play the Sape' melody along with other musical instruments such as the Bamboo Flute, Jatung Utang, Big Guitar and several other musical instruments for every official, festive and religious ceremony. Every Sape' music that is played cannot be separated from the traditional dances of the Orang Ulu community such as Ngajat Lasan, Datun Julud, Kancet Ajai, Lekopa and the Unity Dance with complete traditional clothing that showcases the patterns and uniqueness of the Orang Ulu community.

The settlement of the Ulu community in Sungai Asap since 1998 has allowed them to continue to balance traditional life with modern development today. The community used to live mostly as farmers but now they have also changed the agricultural system by focusing more on the cultivation of industrial crops such as Palm Oil, Black Pepper and Rubber. In addition, they still continue to plant hill rice, vegetables and other cash crops on a small scale to maintain the culture of life that has been a way of life since ancient times. To meet the needs of food and tourism



services, there are also many Ulu ethnic people in the Belaga Asap Area involved in aquaculture, contractors and small businesses.

The venue for the iRandau 2025 conference which will be held from 1 to 3 October 2025 at the Lebu' Kulit Sungai Asap Multipurpose Hall, Belaga, Sarawak. Participants attending the conference from Bintulu town can follow the PAN Borneo Bintulu–Bakun highway until they reach Simpang Sg Asap, then continue to Kampung Lebu' Kulit Sungai Asap. The journey from Bintulu covers a distance of approximately 142 km and takes approximately 2 hours by car. This map shows the full route from Bintulu town to Sungai Asap and marks relevant landmarks, including the conference hall, food court, school and longhouse area for orientation upon arrival.

Among the featured activities are Cultural and Arts Night, showcasing traditional performances and photography sessions in traditional Orang Ulu costumes. Participants can also enjoy a Fun Walk and participate in practical demonstrations that emphasize sustainability and heritage.

This unique combination of academic discourse and sustainability edu-tourism provides an inspiring backdrop for meaningful discussions, the exchange of research findings, and the building of professional networks. ## KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

### **Prof. Datuk Dr. Jayum Jawan**



Prof. Datuk Dr. Jayum is a Fellow of the Chair of the Institution of Malay Rulers at UiTM, Adjunct Professor at UNIMAS and the inaugural holder of the Tan Sri Empiang Jabu Research Chair. He is also a Fellow of the Academy of Sciences Malaysia and a Member of the National Unity Advisory Council. Holding a PhD in Southeast Asian Studies from the University of Hull, UK, he is an expert in ethnic politics, nation-building, and political culture. Between 2015–2017, he held the Tun Abdul Razak Distinguished Chair and was a Visiting Professor at Ohio University, USA. He has supervised more than 50 postgraduate students and published over 30 books together with multiple scholarly articles in reputable journals.

### **YB Tuan Kennedy Chukpai Ugon**



YB Tuan Kennedy has served as the State Assemblyman (ADUN) for Murum since 2016, in addition to holding the positions of Deputy President of SDNU and President of the Forum (Federation of Orang Ulu Associations Malaysia). His legislative and community engagement efforts focus on advancing rural infrastructure development in areas such as Tubau including electricity, water supply, road networks, and Internet connectivity. He is also promoting local cultural heritage (Kenyah Cultural Festival) as a
